



# Kirkwood Road environmental improvements

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed route) (Kirkwood Road) (No. 1) Traffic Order 201\*

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above order under sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the order would be to prohibit motor vehicles, with the exemption of pedal cycles, from entering into or proceeding in that part of KIRKWOOD ROAD which lies north-west of a point 60 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Lugard Road.

# Statement of reasons

# Kirkwood Road environmental improvements

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed route) (Kirkwood Road) (No. 1) Traffic Order 201\*

Kirkwood Nature Reserve is located within the Queen's Road ward in the London Borough of Southwark. The north end of Kirkwood Road, which leads to the Kirkwood Nature reserve, is currently used for fly-tipping and non-permit parking.

The Friends of Cossall Park and Kirkwood Nature Reserve have been awarded funding through the Council's Cleaner Greener Safer programme to close this part of Kirkwood road to motorvehicles, and re-landscape to improve the space for local residents and visitors to the area.

The proposed improvements would include:

- creating a paved area
- adding planters with shrubs and trees
- building raised beds with plants
- installing removable bollards

The bollards will be installed just north of the railway bridge, and will be removable to enable Network Rail to have access for repairs.

The proposed changes will decrease fly tipping and inconsiderate parking in the area; and create an attractive entrance to the reserve.



# TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

The council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>a</sup>, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

### Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed route) (Kirkwood Road) (No. 1) Traffic Order 201\* and shall come into force on xx xxxx 201x.

#### Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"kerb-line" means the imaginary line which is the projection of the line formed by the edge of the carriageway of a street;

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Any reference in this Order to a named street (or part thereof) means a street bearing that name which lies within the London Borough of Southwark.

#### Prescribed route

No person shall cause any motor vehicle other than a pedal cycle to enter into or proceed in that part of Kirkwood Road which lies north-west of a point 60 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Lugard Road.

### **Exemptions**

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3.1 preceding shall apply in relation to:-
  - (a) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; or
  - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
  - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
  - (d) any vehicle being used for the maintenance, improvement, re-construction, cleansing or lighting of that part of street; or
  - (e) any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to that part of street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any communications network (within the meaning of the Communications Act 2003<sup>b</sup>); or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street or part of street.
