Please also arrange for this letter to be uploaded to the Council's website forthwith.

In view of the time constraints the Tribunal proposes sending joining details for the CMH on 30 August 2023, to those leaseholders who have indicated a wish to participate at the final hearing.

The invitations will be sent to the leaseholders at their email addresses on the list provided to the Tribunal by the Council.

The leaseholders are not required to join the CMH, it is entirely up to each leaseholder to decide.

Any leaseholder joining the CMH is not required to participate, they can just observe if they wish.

Leaseholders can arrange for others to represent them at the CMH.

Any leaseholder who has not indicated a wish to participate in a hearing may still observe the CMH and the final hearing, but they will need to provide their contact details to the Council.

Leaseholders who intend joining the CMH are reminded that the CMH is purely procedural, the Tribunal will not hear any argument or evidence, the purpose is to establish a timeline for any further steps that are required to be taken by the parties to bring this matter to a final hearing.
