1. Introduction

- 1.1. The Old Kent Road Area Action Plan (AAP) is a plan to regenerate the Old Kent Road and surrounding area. It sets out a vision for how the area will change over the period leading up to 2036. This includes delivering 20,000 new homes and 5,000 additional jobs. The vision is supported by a strategy with policies we will put in place to deliver it. The AAP will make sure that over the next twenty years we get the right development needed to support a healthy, safe and prosperous community and a fairer future for all in the Old Kent Road area.
- 1.2. The AAP will be part of our framework of planning documents. It will be a material planning consideration in deciding planning applications in the opportunity area. It will help ensure that we make decisions transparently, providing clarity for members of the public and giving more confidence to developers to invest in the area. It will also be an opportunity area planning framework (OAPF) and will be endorsed by the Mayor of London.
- 1.3. Following analysis of the consultation responses received the council is now proposing to make some significant changes to a small number of policies in the AAP prior to preparing the final version of the plan.

The purpose and objectives of this plan

- 1.4. The process of reviewing the AAP needs to involve local community groups, residents, landowners, developers and businesses at each stage to ensure that the plan meets the needs of those living in, working in and visiting the Old Kent Road area.
- 1.5. The purpose of this consultation plan is to make sure that we involve local people in preparing these documents in a way that considers their needs. There are minimum legal requirements for consultation we need to follow which you can read about in sections 2 and 3 below.

2. How we are consulting

- 2.1. We carry out consultation in accordance with our adopted statement of community involvement, which explains how we will consult the community in the preparation of planning policy documents. The following section sets out how we plan to meet the minimum statutory consultation requirements and how we will exceed these requirements where appropriate.
- 2.2. In the current stage of consultation we will invite members of the public and other stakeholders to make representations on the draft AAP. Further details of the next steps for each document are set out in section 5.
- 2.3. This consultation plan should be read alongside the following documents:

- The draft Old Kent Road Area Action Plan This sets out our draft proposals for the AAP.
- 2.4. In addition there are a number of supporting documents that the reader may wish to consult. These include:

Integrated Impact Assessment of the AAP This analyses the economic, environmental and social impacts of the AAP and identifies mitigating measures where necessary. It also incorporates equalities analysis and a health impact assessment.

Habitat regulations assessments of the AAP Carried out under the EU Habitats Directive, this assess the effects of land use plans on European sites to determine whether there will be any 'likely significant effects' as a result of the plan's implementation.

• Consultation Report

A high level consultation summary has been produced on our website for all responses received from previous stages of consultation. A consultation report has been prepared in respect of the to the changes to the policies in the draft AAP.

3. The timetable and methods of consultation

Consultation timeframe

- 3.1. In accordance with Southwark's statement of community involvement (SCI), the draft AAP will be available for comment over a twelve week period from 21 June 2017.
- 3.2. All responses must be received by 5pm on 13 September 2016.

Consultation methods

- 3.3. The documents will be published on the council's website and made available at libraries, My Southwark service points and the council's Tooley Street offices. An advert publicising the documents being consulted on will be put in the press and written notification will be sent to around 5500 contacts on the Planning Policy mailing list and My Southwark.
- 3.4. The two tables below sets out details of the statutory minimum required to meet Government regulations and the further additional methods of consultation that we intend to carry out. We include dates where we have meetings confirmed. We also set out the key consultee groups that the consultation method is aimed at.
