Bermondsey Neighbourhood: Summary

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The Bermondsey neighbourhood in Southwark is home to around 46,400 residents

SUMMARY

The Bermondsey neighbourhood sits in the north-east of Southwark on the Thames river, and covers three of the borough's electoral wards; North Bermondsey, South Bermondsey, and London Bridge & West Bermondsey. Around 46,400 residents live in the Bermondsey neighbourhood, roughly 43% of which identify with a non-White ethnic background, making the neighbourhood less ethnically diverse when compared to the borough average.

Notable inequality exists across the neighbourhood. While South Bermondsey sees among the borough's highest rates of disability, unemployment, and low English proficiency; North Bermondsey, and London Bridge & West Bermondsey wards experience much less social and economic disadvantage. However, crime rates in London Bridge & West Bermondsey are substantially above the neighbourhood and borough averages.

Some of the poorest child health outcomes in the borough are seen in the Bermondsey area, with notably lower breastfeeding coverage rates; higher emergency hospital admission rates in young children aged under 5; and higher prevalence of child excess weight at Year 6, when compared to Southwark.

The neighbourhood has higher rates of all-cause emergency hospital admissions, and hospital admissions related to alcohol, COPD, and coronary heart disease, when compared to Southwark. However, the prevalence of long-term conditions is generally similar to that across the borough as a whole.
