Nunhead & Peckham Rye Neighbourhood: Summary

The Nunhead and Peckham Rye neighbourhood is home to 25,700 of Southwark's residents

SUMMARY

The Nunhead and Peckham Rye neighbourhood covers the electoral wards of Nunhead & Queen's Road, and Peckham Rye, and sits on the border with Lewisham. It is home to around 25,700 residents, and has a similar proportion of non-White identifying populations as Southwark as a whole. However, more ethnic diversity is seen in the ward of Nunhead & Queen's Road which has 55% of its residents identifying as non-White.

The area has some of the highest levels of social and economic disadvantage in Southwark, with Nunhead & Queen's Road ranking 3rd most disadvantaged community in the borough. There are higher levels of unemployment and worklessness related to ill-health in the Nunhead and Peckham Rye neighbourhood compared to Southwark as a whole, and substantially higher disability.

There is notable disparity within the neighbourhood. Nunhead & Queen's Road faces significantly lower life expectancy for both males and females, and poorer health outcomes including higher levels of preventable mortality and hospital admissions. This is in contrast to Peckham Rye, which has hospital admissions significantly below Southwark, and higher life expectancies. However, the neighbourhood overall sees better child health outcomes when compared to Southwark as a whole. Coverage of breastfeeding, child excess weight, and emergency admissions in children under five are better than the borough average.
