### **Old Kent Road Neighbourhood: Summary**

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# The Old Kent Road neighbourhood is home to around 19,000 of Southwark's residents

#### **SUMMARY**

The Old Kent Road neighbourhood covers just one of the borough's electoral wards: Old Kent Road. This is the most populous ward in Southwark, home to around 19,000 residents. The neighbourhood is the most ethnically diverse in Southwark, with around two-thirds of the population identifying with a non-White ethnic background.

Old Kent Road has high levels of social disadvantage, with one-tenth of the population unemployed, and ranking 6<sup>th</sup> most deprived community in the borough. The area has worse child health outcomes when compared to Southwark, with the lowest rate of breastfeeding coverage in the borough; and a significantly higher prevalence of child excess weight.

The area also faces higher prevalence of long-term conditions such as diabetes, and hypertension, when compared to Southwark. All-cause emergency hospital admissions, and hospital admissions related to alcohol, are also significantly higher in the Old Kent Road area, alongside higher mortality from causes such as cancer, and cardiovascular disease.
